

Scholarship Foundation Awards \$738,500 to Class of 2017

Scholarship Foundation awarded 105 college scholarships to 53 local students at its 52nd Annual Awards Ceremony, held at the Vero Beach High School's Performing Arts Center on May 17, 2017. This year's recipients will receive \$738,500 in need-based financial aid over the next four years to attend 20 colleges and universities in nine states.

Parents, friends, alumni and donors gathered as scholarship sponsors and board members presented the awards. Lindsay Nolan, a 2013 recipient of Scholarship Foundation's Herget Foundation Scholarship, gave the alumnus address. Lindsay, who graduated in 2013 from VBHS, has just received her B.S. from the University of South Florida majoring in biomedical sciences. First in her family to graduate from college, she did so debt-free, thanks to her scholarship and her work. She urged recipients to "take advantage of every opportunity that comes your way and don't be afraid to step out of your comfort zone."

This year's scholarship packages ranged from \$4,000 to \$30,000 for the most prestigious Richardson and Jaffe awards. These highly competitive awards went to:

Richardson Scholar Awards: St. Edward's senior Zach Alerte, who will attend Harvard University with a major in chemistry and history and Sebastian River senior Brittany Evans, who will attend UF, with a major in chemistry.

Frances and Ronald Jaffe Education Foundation Awards: St. Edward's senior Michael Burke, who will attend Georgia Tech with a major in computer science and Sebastian River senior Martha Grudens, who will attend UCF with a major in mechanical engineering.

Sengupta Family Scholarship.

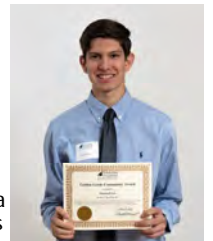
