> **Scholarship News Inside** Class of 2024

It is the mission of Scholarship Foundation of Indian River County to offer hope, encouragement and scholarship opportunities to Indian River County students with financial need who demonstrate the desire and academic ability to succeed in pursuing a post-secondary education.

Since 1965, Scholarship Foundation has awarded more than \$15.5M in need-based college scholarships to 3,140 Indian River County students. All of our support results from the generosity of local individuals, businesses and foundations.

Community Generosity Enriches Lives!



Thanks to the continued generosity and support of the Indian River County community, Scholarship Foundation awarded \$727,750 in new need-based scholarships on May 14, 2024 at its 59th Annual Awards Ceremony which was held this year at St. Edward's High School Waxlax Center. Thirty-eight local students, including four recipients already in college and eight high school seniors who will receive their AA degrees from IRSC this year, received 91 scholarships to study at 19 colleges and universities in five states and Washington, DC. Individual awards, which are tailored to each student's financial need, range from \$4,000 to \$30,000. Awards are payable over the 2, 3, or 4 years each recipient is expected to take to achieve their undergraduate degree.

A 2018 graduate of SRHS and recipient of Scholarship Foundation's Nugent Memorial Scholarship, Alexus Woods is now a dedicated advocate for youth empowerment and community development. She graduated Magna Cum Laude from Stetson University in 2022 with a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology and a minor in Entrepreneurship, and she was recognized as the Outstanding Senior in the Department of Sociology. Over the past two years, she has dedicated herself to making a tangible impact in the nonprofit sector, using her passion for social justice to bring about positive social change and inspire others to do the same. In her address, she said, "As I stand before you, I am reminded of the profound impact that education and community support can have on shaping the trajectory of one's life. My journey through college was not just about earning a degree; it was a transformative experience enriched by my community engagement work and involvement in Stetson's Bonner Program. I acknowledge that I would not have

been able to have this experience without the financial support scholarships provided. They not only allowed me to graduate debt-free but allowed me to immerse myself in learning, and explore my passions without the constant worry of how to pay for tuition, books, or living expenses. For that, I will be forever thankful."
